





Fiscal Year (07/01 - 06/30) Comparison to Date



- For the 2015 Fiscal Year, Sunday Offertory Collections are 3% above the budgeted collection amount. This results in a fiscal year to date deficit of \$266,152.
- For the 2015 fiscal year, the cost per family per week is \$37 as 430 families contribute to the Parish.
- Our goal is to fund all operations and expenses from the weekly collections, i.e. the goal is for the stripped bars to exceed the black bars in the chart above.
- St. Teresa's annual fundraisers assist in meeting funding gaps. It is the Finance Council's and Fr. Frank's goal to increase weekly giving to meet our ongoing expenses, and use the proceeds from fundraisers to fund special initiatives and outreach programs of the Parish.

Treasures from Our Tradition

There are plenty of "treasures" in our tradition that if resurrected today would cause anxious moments for bishops!


Many concern marriage. There was a time when the church "consecrated" both virgins dedicated to prayer and charity, and brides dedicated to husband and family. Virgins were blessed in the sanctuary of the church, and brides in the sanctuary of the home. The custom of blessing the bride in the marriage chamber was standard in England, Ireland, Spain, and France until the eleventh century.

If the groom (the groom's side planned the wedding) chose from the full menu of liturgy, there would be a blessing of the bridal room, solemn evening prayer on the eve and morning prayer on the day of the wedding, a blessing at the church door of the spouses, and then in the church for the wife alone during Mass, and Communion. After the feast, a priest would represent the bride's father in presiding over the legal process by which the bride transferred from her father's clan to her husband's. Some enduring customs hearken back to these days when marriage was seen as a contract between men (the bride's father and the groom) and was not so much about living out one's baptismal call, and certainly not about the equality of the spouses in Christ. Happily, this baptismal focus has been restored and unhelpful customs set aside by today's marriage rite. — Rev. James Field, Copyright @ J. S. Paluch Co.

The Trinity is Love

Theologians throughout the Christian centuries have

spilled much ink (and, on occasion, some blood) in describing and defining the mystery of the Holy Trinity. One of the earliest, most poetic, and beautiful descriptions comes from St. Augustine in *De Trinitas*, wherein he describes the Trinity as One (the Father) who loves, One (the Son) who is loved, and One (the Spirit) who is love. And these three Ones are also one Three.

It might be wisest for us to leave the technical wranglings to the academic theologians, and focus on the fact that the three Persons of the Trinity are indeed persons; they are best known and understood in their love for each other and for us. We are made in the image of those loving persons, and our best relationships are lived out in the context of love. Truly loving relationships are inexhaustible mysteries to be lived in joy. If this is true of our human relationships, how much more so is it true of our relationship with the Trinity. And how much more does it call upon us to be joyful, loving witnesses of the holy mystery of the One-in-Three. This is the mystery to which we were called when we were chosen to be God's own, baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity. Copyright © J. S. Palluch Co.





Community of Love


Years ago, when I was a journalism graduate student, I made friends with a young student from the Sudan who was a devout Muslim. He was eager to share his culture with Americans, and I was grateful to have a chance to learn about his world.

Inevitably, we got around to religion. Over a pizza in a restaurant near the J-school, he asked about the Christian belief in the Trinity. For him, monotheism was so essential to an absolute idea of God that the notion that there could somehow be three persons in one God, each of them God and yet together only one God, made no sense to him.

We did not get very far in theological terms to resolving this, but I recall trying share my sense that for the mystery of God to be more than a pure idea, we can only grasp it through our human experience. To believe that "God is love" relates God to our human experience of love. The idea that the one God is at the same time a community of love can, by analogy, offer some insights into the dynamic inner life of God.

It took Pentecost, an experience of earthquake, fire and wind, to open the Jewish minds of Jesus' first followers to begin to grasp the meaning of this. Christians were already singing hymns and saying prayers as early as the second century to identify and worship God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Here is one possible path. According to the scriptures that Christians, Jews and Muslims share, "Man" (male and female together) is created in the image and likeness of God. As husband and wife, two distinct individuals become one in love and reflect God's image as one. When their love produces a child, they extend God's image and likeness to new life. God's inner life of self-giving love is made visible in three persons, a trinity that reveals God.

This approach to God by way of love has moved poets and mystics beyond the borders of

logic. The Bible guides the heart through the Torah to the Canticle of Canticles, where the language of love alone can "explain" the movement of God toward humanity and the heart-wrenching pity of God to embrace us in nuptial covenant.

The Bible attests to God as unapproachable Light that sends Wisdom, the female face of God, to teach us how to love. God breathes forth God the Holy Spirit to create and sanctify the world. God as Father speaks a Word who is Son to be the template for creation and the instrument for renewing a fallen world. God enters the world in the incarnate Son. Father and Son together send their Spirit to extend this redemptive mystery into every generation.

The challenge of understanding God is also the central challenge facing a world deeply divided by religion. It was Karl Rahner, one of the great theologians of Vatican II, who saw the Trinity as the perfect image of a world united not by the triumph of one faith over all others, but as the community in dialogue to form unity in diversity. One table with many places, one humanity held together by justice and love.

In this vision rests the future of humanity, and it looks a lot like the Trinity. One God, revealed as the creative source of all love, draws all of us forward to stand together in the image and likeness of God.
