Fiscal Year Holiday Cheer

We are at that time of year where we give our Annual Report to the Archdiocese of Chicago. This year's report is particularly important as the Archdiocese reviews various parishes for potential consolidation under its *Renew My Church* program. Here is a review of St. Teresa's Fiscal Year 2017 (July 2016 – June 2017).

Monthly Sunday Collections:


As our Fiscal Year 2017 (July 2016 – June 2017) has ended, we are doing better than we were last fiscal year (July 2015 – June 2016). Our Sunday collections totaled \$592,596, a 5% increase from 2016 and a 17% increase from 2015. Our Sunday Collections cover nearly 75% of St. Teresa's operating expenses.

Thank you to the parishioners of St. Teresa. Without your continued help, we would not be on a path to a more stable financial position.

Time of Your Life:

The recently (last month) concluded *Time Of Your Life* fundraiser was by far the most successful event in parish history. The net proceeds from TOYL was \$200k for the event on November 2017, which is a **nearly 20% increase** from the event in November 2016. (The \$200k is in the FISCAL 2018. Fiscal year 2018 = the time period of July 2017 – June 2018). The Time of Your Life Gala team did an amazing job and has set yet another record to beat for next year's event.

Treasures from Tradition

There's no more unusual setting to celebrate today's Feast of the Holy Family than Barcelona, Spain and the towering unfinished sandcastle known officially as the Temple Expiatori de la Sagrada Familia. In 1882, the plan was hatched to build a vast place of worship in reparation for

the revolutionary and liberal leanings of the city. The modern artist Antoni Gaudi, dedicated his life to the project, living in the building, attending Mass daily, and giving up his personal wealth. When people pressed him to pick up the pace, he responded, "My client is not in a hurry." (Gaudi's cause for beatification is moving along, and he could be the first professional artist and architect to be beatified.) The Spanish

Civil War halted work in 1935. In the 1950s work began anew, speeded up by computers in the 1980s. Still, the final stage of construction is not due to end until 2026. If the original methods had stayed in place, it would take several hundred more years to complete the plan. So far there are eight towers, with four to go. The highest steeple is three feet shorter than the nearest hill, since the architect didn't want his work to surpass God's artistry. The three faces of the basilica each have three doors, with the faces named Passion, Nativity, and Grace. The interior is crammed with geometric figures that almost seem to spin, crazy-quilt windows, spiral staircases, and jumbles of statues and figures. Although inspired by ancient Gothic cathedrals, the style is called Expressionist, and very little is left unexpressed by the masonry. Bearers of the Word

The Church has placed a number of notable feast days La Iglesia ha puesto unos cuantos días de fiesta notables

immediately after Christmas. The feasts of Stephen, John the Evangelist, and the Holy Innocents form a summary of the life lived in Christ. the Word made flesh. What do these have to do with the feast of the Holy Family, which crowns the Octave of Christmas? These feasts remind us that suffering will occur in fulfilling the mission of Christ, and that we

are all called to be bearers of this Word whose birth we celebrate.

We also see this manifested in the lives of Joseph and Mary, both of whom took social and religious risks in obedience to the will of God, and both of whom were open to the word of God sent to them from on high. In these ways they prefigured the life of Jesus himself.

Most likely, few of us found ourselves at Mass this past Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday, but the essence of these feasts and the essence of the holiness of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus remain central, a holiness we celebrate today. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.



Renew My Church

As we approach the end of the year, it is a time to give thanks for the blessings that have been given to us by God: new life, marriage, healing, successes, family and friends. We also are grateful for the times that have challenged our spirits, giving us the chance to *truly trust* in God's presence, especially in these difficult times of struggle, illness, marriage uncertainties, the many problems facing our youth, and the constant threat of violence and war. We say goodbye, perhaps good riddance, to 2017 and we look forward to 2018 in hope and an optimism grounded in reality.

Let us pray for *Renew My Church*, which begins on February 3. As you know, St. Teresa will be working with our neighboring parishes of St. Vincent, St Josaphat, St. Michael and Immaculate Conception/St Joseph, trying to come together to share resources and connect our ministries where needed.



Each parish has a small group of three parishioners, the pastor and maybe one other staff person to represent the parish. I have asked Barb McHugh, Justin Alden, and Ellen Moiani to represent our parish in this process. These parishioners do a great job in sharing the vision of St. Teresa with the other parish groups. Each small group will meet approximately 6 or 7 times, with a parish-wide meeting twice, during the months between February and May.

The first half of 2018 will be very important for all the parishes going through *Renew My Church*. By Summer or early Fall we should have an idea as to how we will proceed in the future, strengthening our resolve to better evangelize, and spread the gospel in this part of Chicago. I have hope for the possibilities that await us. All the parishes in our group are strong and have a unique part to play in the larger church. Coming together will only strengthen our mission.

I invite all parishioners to try and come to daily Mass, which is 7:30 am and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesdays from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm. I will be hearing Confessions and celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the time of Adoration. What a beautiful way to start the New Year.


